If someone you love is in danger you would do your best to help them. This is what Jesus is doing in today's parable. The Jewish religion had been manipulated to suit men's opinions, and he points out the danger, and the lengths people can go to get their own way. His listeners understood him but failed to apply the lesson to themselves. Jesus wanted them to recognise their error in case they would lose the kingdom. Like the stone rejected by the builder, which became the keystone, their unbelief in him, would lead them further from the truth they were seeking.

God's love includes everyone. We want Jesus Christ to be the keystone of our lives. We believe that in him, and in his Church, we have a truth that sets us free, which keeps us on the best path for our lives. Each Sunday, we encounter him in the Eucharist where he strengthens us for the week ahead. He calls each of us to follow him in a way that attracts others to the truth about himself.

Today much unbelief and error obscures the truth about God – the western world is slowly writing God off and much of our culture, as in the gospel, not only dilutes what God has said but runs counter to it. Yet God still loves the world in spite of this rejection.

If we believe Jesus, to choose a path contrary to God's leads to man's downfall. At the start of the third millennium, the late Pope John Paul II called us to become "schools of prayer" for our world, to follow Christ in our love of God and our neighbour, as "communities of holiness". Two thousand years after Christ, we are his Church in the heart of the world. If we do not use our gifts, God may take them from us. If we use them, he works with us. In the words of the popular hymn, we are the "Here I am, Lord" when he asks "Whom shall I send?"

St Vincent de Paul

Last Tuesday, 27 September, was a day of memorial for St Vincent de Paul but how much do we know of this saint?

He was born in 1581 into a peasant family in France, began divinity studies in 1596 at the University of Toulouse and was ordained at the age of 20.

He was captured by Turkish pirates and sold into slavery but was freed in 1607 when he converted one of his owners to Christianity.

Returning to France, he served as parish priest near Paris where he started organizations to help the poor, nursed the sick, found jobs for the unemployed, etc.

He became chaplain at the court of Henry IV of France and with Louise de Marillac, founded the Congregation of the Daughters of Charity. He also instituted the Congregation of Priests of the Mission and worked always for the poor, the enslaved, the abandoned, the ignored, and those that society had no time for.

He died in 1660 at Paris and was canonized in 1737 by Pope

Pope's prayer intentions for October

In his prayer intentions for the month of October, Pope Benedict focuses his attention on asking God to strengthen Christians in the face of an increasingly hostile secular society.

The Pope's general prayer intention for the month is, "That Christians may not be discouraged by the attacks of secularized society, but with complete trust, may bear witness to their faith and hope."

Likewise, his mission intention is, "That the faithful may join to their fundamental duty of prayer the support also of economic contributions to the missionary works."

Pope John Paul I

Wednesday 28th September was the anniversary of the death of Pope John Paul I who died only 33 days into his pontificate (August 26, 1978 - September 28, 1978). It was one of the shortest reigns in the history of the papacy.

The "Smiling Pope", as he was affectionately called, was a staunch believer in ecumenism and the reduction of Church wealth. He was warm, humble and had no aspirations for the papacy. After Pope Paul VI died, he was elected on the second day of the conclave in 1978 which became known as the Year of the Three Popes with Paul VI, John Paul I and, of course, John Paul II.

The Gift of Scripture

On Friday the Catholic Church in Scotland launched a new document on Biblical Scripture aimed at fostering greater understanding of the bible and encouraging scriptural study. "The Gift of Scripture" is a collaborative effort by the Bishops' Conference of Scotland, together with the Bishops' Conference of England and Wales.

Archbishop Mario Conti said, "I had the privilege of presenting the first copy of the document to the Holy Father in Rome recently. During our audience with the Pope, he said: 'I would like to recommend the ancient tradition of Lectio divina: the diligent reading of Sacred Scripture accompanied by prayer, which brings about that intimate dialogue in which the person reading hears God who is speaking, and in praying, responds to him with trusting openness of heart."

The Pope added, "If it is effectively promoted, this practice will bring to the Church - I am convinced of it - a new spiritual springtime."

The Archbishop added: "The inspiration offered in this new document of the Bishops' Conferences of England and Wales and Scotland will both inform and encourage all those who wish to make scripture more central to the faith and devotional life of the Church."

CHANCELLOR MARKS SCIAF'S 40TH ANNIVERSARY

Gordon Brown MP, Chancellor of the Exchequer, is giving a lecture in honour of the 40th anniversary of SCIAF in Edinburgh on Friday, 7th October. It is one of a series of events to mark this important milestone.

Over the past 40 years, SCIAF's long term support for poor communities in the developing world, its response to the many humanitarian emergencies which all too often occur and its work towards building a just world have grown considerably, thanks to the generosity and commitment of Scots across the country.

SCIAF has become Scotland's leading aid agency with a global outreach and in its 40th anniversary year is taking a leading role in the Make Poverty History campaign.
