NEW PUBLICATIONS

Alloway and Southern Ayrshire Family History Society have recently published two new complete volumes of monumental inscriptions from Carrick.


Colmonell Kirkyard Monumental Inscriptions (ISBN 0-6542897-1-4 UK price $\pounds 6.00$ inc. p&p) contains over 400 inscriptions and includes the War Memorial, inscriptions within the church and inscriptions from the memorials within the Knockdolian Vault.

Barrhill was also in the parish of Colmonell but due to the position of the parish church, only three miles from the west end of a parish nearly twenty miles long, a quod sacra church was built at Arnsheen and this eventually became the Parish of Arnsheen and Barhill in 1930. Barrhill Old Cemetery Monumental Inscriptions (ISBN 0-9542897-2-2 UK price £4.50 inc. p&p) contains nearly 200 inscriptions and includes those from the War Memorial, the Martyr's Tomb and Pinmore Church, Laighaldons.
