


om Barclay is a kenspeckle figure in Ayrshire as the Council's Local Studies Librarian based at the Carnegie Library, Ayr. He is a native of Stewarton, where he currently resides. He has spoken previously to the Society about the Roundheads in Ayrshire and exiled Covenanters in the Carolinas. His talk will cover the widespread trade in the 17th century involving many Carrick families including relatives of Robert Burns. Recent research names the people and places, such as the "Battle" of Hollowshean Muir between the revenue officers and troops against the smugglers.
