




or centuries there had been dissatisfaction and reform movements within the established Church. For example Cluny in Burgundy was founded in the 10th century as a reforming movement and became the leading light in Christendom.

The question, the talk addresses, is when did dissatisfaction become division and what happened in Scotland? Although not obvious at the time, it can now be argued, that the end results of the reform movements in Scotland differed from other European countries. The results of The Reformation still impact on Scotlish society today. The Reformation in Scotland did not happen overnight and the talk will highlight some of the changes and events which brought it about. The talk provides an interesting journey through a turbulent period of Scottish history.
