Boys Rugby

Carrick Academy had another busy weekend with three teams playing. The highlight taking place on Sunday afternoon when Carrick managed to field an under 15 and under 18 girls sides in the girls Scottish Cup Round 1 This means that over the past 4 weeks the school have managed to field 7 sides. In the boys section the 1st XV, 2nd XV, Under 15, 14 and 13 have fielded teams and with Carrick being one of few schools in the country that can field two girls sides this means seven sides are now playing out of the school. In total Carrick Academy have now fielded 135 players out of a school roll of 515 this season. If you add to that success Carrick Rugby Club sitting joint top of their league and managing to field an S1/2 club side last Sunday, then the future of Carrick Rugby looks in bright.

This initiative is an academic and business challenge delivered by the partnership of the Ayrshire Branch of the Chartered Management Institute, and Ayrshire Chamber (of commerce and industry).

The Aims of the Initiative are:

- to provide students with practice and skills in CV composition and job interviewing
- to give students the opportunity to see managers managing
- to develop student skills in report writing and making presentations
- to utilise the unique link between Ayrshire business and education establishments delivered by Ayrshire Chamber
- to promote the services available from the Chartered Management Institute.

The initiative has been running for 7 years. Carrick has taken part for the last 5 years winning the Ayrshire Final in 2003 (Terri Wilson) and 2004 (Emma Robinson). In 2006 Linzi Scobie was runner up in the Final and won the South Ayrshire Trophy.

In 2007, after an interview in school, Elizabeth McJannet was chosen to represent the school. Elizabeth shadowed Stuart Telfer from Ayrshire and Arran Health Board for 3 days. She submitted a report on her experiences and was selected as an Ayrshire finalist.

On 3 December 2007 Elizabeth attended Oswald Hall at Auchencruive, along with 5 other finalists, to deliver a presentation on her work shadowing experience to a panel of judges and a number of invited guests.

The standard was, as usual, extremely high. Although very nervous, Elizabeth gave an excellent presentation and answered questions from the judges in a confident manner. After a, seemingly, endless wait, the results were announced. Elizabeth was award first place. She was awarded the Ayrshire Work Shadowing Shield and the South Ayrshire Trophy as well as £100.
