


Press Pack's last News

Carrick Academy 1st XV travelled down to Wales at the beginning of the month. They played two games that were both closely contested. The first game was against a much older and bigger Pontycymmer side. It really was a battle of their strength against Carrick's organisation. The final score was 12 - 10 to the Welsh boys. The hospitality afterwards was excellent and the boys made friends with the Welsh boys so much so that they all turned up at our hotel the next day to come and support us for our second tour game against Maesteg. This again turned out to be a closely fought encounter; Carrick led 20-7 at half time but for some reason switched off in the second and ended up losing 20-26.

The tour was a massive success and the boys all had a great time. The Millennium stadium tour was a tour highlight. Plans have been put in place for the 1st XV to visit our newly found friends next season (5th April to the 10th April 2009) with Maesteg visiting us at some point next season.
