

Schools to be consulted on enhancement of school nurse service

NHS Ayrshire & Arran has been given the go-ahead to consult South Ayrshire's schools on proposals to enhance the existing school nurse service.

School nurses currently provide free, confidential advice and support at drop-in clinics in secondary schools in Ayrshire and Arran, where pupils can get information on a range of health issues. These clinics support young people who may be experiencing any number of health concerns, ranging from weight issues to mental health problems - for example, stress. Support and advice is provided within a familiar environment by a dedicated school nurse.

South Ayrshire Council has accepted our proposal to consult fully with parents on enhancements which would include:

Pregnancy and Chlamydia testing

Access to the C-card scheme. This involves a full one-to-one consultation with a school nurse, after which a young person may be issued with a card, which can be presented at registered health premises in exchange for condoms

Evidence shows that NHS Ayrshire & Arran has one of the highest teenage pregnancy rates for girls aged between 13 and 15 in Scotland (ISD Scotland 2005). We want to reduce teenage pregnancies in this age group by 20 per cent by 2010. Following the introduction of this enhanced service in England, teenage pregnancy rates in the district of Hackney² reduced by 28 per cent.

The number of people in Scotland being diagnosed with Chlamydia is also rising. This sexually transmitted infection often shows no symptoms and can lead to ectopic pregnancies and infertility. NHS Dumfries & Galloway recently reported a significant uptake in Chlamydia testing following a pilot initiative within all secondary schools.

Sina Currie, NHS Ayrshire & Arran's school nurse co-ordinator said: "School nurses currently provide an invaluable service for young people in an environment where they feel comfortable. We hope that this service could be enhanced to offer a fully holistic service.

"If both the school and parents accept these proposals young people will be able to access pregnancy and Chlamy-dia testing and the c-card scheme through their school nurse. This scheme does not involve dispensing condoms on school premises. Any young person requesting these services would have a full consultation with the school nurse. In addition to providing advice and support, we would also be able to offer access to other appropriate health services based on each individual's needs."

NHS Ayrshire & Arran is in discussions with East and North Ayrshire Councils regarding this enhanced school nurse service and we will work in partnership with our local authority colleagues to consult with schools and parents in these areas.

Rugby Report

Last year Carrick 1st XV defeated Largs in the Ayrshire league semi final by 29-5, on Wednesday of this week Carrick managed to defeat Largs again with a similar score line of 28-5. However this game was a lot tighter than the final score suggests. Carrick were 8-0 up at half time with a try from Greg Montgomery and a penalty from David Logan. The second half started off with Largs coming back into the game by scoring a try of their own. Carrick eventually got into their stride with a 7 minute spell which saw them score 3 tries, 1 conversion and a penalty. Carrick won and from the South Ayrshire point of view that's all that can be said. Largs however were far more competitive than they were last year and can be disappointed that Carrick pulled away from them towards the end of the game.

Michael Paton gave an honest assessment of the Carrick performance after the game:

" All credit to Largs who played very well but we were not at the races. We didn't perform well in any aspect of the game but we did grind out the win and that's all that can be said of today. If we play like that next week we will have no chance of winning"

Next weeks game is against a Marr Development XV at home on Wednesday 5th November. Carrick played Marr 3 times last season so both sides know each other well. Carrick won the opening fixture last season by 12-5 while Marr reversed this result at College Fields by 15-12. The Cup Final was also close with Marr winning 10-3. The Carrick boys know that this will be a massive challenge for them with Marr now fielding a Development XV in the competition and if they perform like they did against Largs then the boys from Troon can be confident of a victory. Kick off is 3.30pm. All spectators are welcome.
