



Well Flushed at Straiton Toilets

Thanks to kind donations, funding from NCCBC, and a week in Maybole Charity Shop, Straiton toilets are secure for another year. Since the village took over from South Ayrshire Council 12 years ago, they have remained open 24/7, even during lockdown. Costs have increased and it now requires £3500 a year to cover cleaning, insurance, water, and electricity. This year the toilets have been painted inside and out and there is also hot water for washing hands. All this requires voluntary work and villagers have put in over 120 hours to get the work done. Users are very kind and leave donations in Straiton Coop. Bus drivers, lorry drivers, walkers and cyclists are grateful to get relief and it makes the effort worthwhile.

By providing this information, a unique e-permit will then be generated which can be used every time a booking is made. Explore the Biosphere!

Did you know ...?



North Carrick is part of a UNESCO

Biosphere – a region recognised for its world class environments and the cultural heritage of its villages and towns. The Galloway & Southern Ayrshire UNESCO Biosphere stands alongside some very famous names: the Black Forest (Germany), Mount Olympus (Greece), Gran Canaria (Spain), Yellowstone (USA), and the Sunshine Coast (Australia) are all designated UNESCO Biospheres, with more than 130 more worldwide.

The GSA Biosphere has just passed its 10th anniversary and 2023 is an extra special year as its regional boundary expands to include the marine environment. This change will bring in three miles of coastal waters, including Ailsa Craig, and meet the boundary of our closest neighbouring UNESCO Biosphere, the Isle of Man.

A UNESCO Biosphere is much more than a geographical location. Galloway and Southern Ayrshire Biosphere has a team of twelve staff leading projects and events, an interactive website, and a lively presence on all the main social media platforms. One of the organisation's priorities is to encourage people to get outdoors and explore, for health and wellbeing and to connect more closely with the wildlife and habitats that are supported through UNESCO status and conservation work.

An initiative currently underway in partnership with South Ayrshire Council and NHS Ayrshire & Arran is the Green Health app, which launched earlier this year. The Biosphere team are helping to highlight opportunities for walking, cycling, gardening/growing, socialising outdoors, and much much more, with a focus on ensuring provision for all ages and abilities. On its own website the GSA Biosphere has an 'Explore' map packed with activities, places





If creatures and critters are indeed your thing there's a rolling opportunity to get involved via 'The Biosphere's Most Wanted', a.k.a. citizen science in the palm of your hand. All that's required is a mobile phone with the iNaturalist app; take photos of any bird, animal, plant, or bug, upload it via the app, and this information will contribute to ongoing research across the Biosphere as agencies work to support species threatened by climate change and human impacts. There is no requirement to have ecological expertise as iNaturalist does all the work of identifying what you have seen.

Perhaps readers already met Jenna Cains at the Maidens World Ocean Day Festival earlier in June. Jenna is the GSA Biosphere's Community and Education lead and is particularly interested in working with local interest groups across North Carrick (and beyond). The organisation welcomes opportunities to speak about the meaning of UNESCO Biosphere status to schools, development trusts, or community collectives. Jenna and her team offer a range of free learning workshops including Carbon Literacy and Biosphere Footsteps, the latter covering a wide range of topics from beavers and dragonflies to community food. 

community. Thanks to Hayley and Maya for facilitating the project which was showcased on 10th June 12-3pm at Maybole Community Gardens.




Sadly, we must report that one of our members, lan Bilson, sadly died early this year. Ian worked tirelessly behind the scenes at each meeting from the group's inception.






COULD IT BE?

NCCBC is funding the development of proposals for this idea. This is in response to the findings of Foundations for Recovery, that we should brand North Carrick as "Bruce Country" and link all of our communities in a "Bruce's Web" of facilities to be enjoyed by local people and visitors alike.



- guide the choice of a site for the statue and what that means for the size of statue.
- carry out an initial site analysis/survey,
- explore how access from the A77 or a smaller road would work,
- · produce an outline site design,
- · submit a a planning in principle application,
- identify any issues around utilities and drainage and outline ideas on energy and net zero,
- · estimate the capital cost and potential sources of funding,
- produce an outline business plan.

Achieving something for North Carrick at a scale and impact similar to the Angel of the North or the Falkirk Kelpies will not be cheap and it will not be easy. But NCCBC is ambitious enough to believe that this is worth exploring. Watch this space. How about a 15m tall Lion of Carrick?

What's growing in the garden?

The growing season is well under way: the raised beds are filling up with veggies; the fruit trees have blossomed and set; and the potatoes are well-established. All thanks to our amazing volunteers and the groups we work with.

It's not just the plants that are growing, so too is our volunteer and helper community, our connections to other community groups, and our on-site facilities. Keep reading for more details.

Community activities

CCFG now have a pizza oven on site! Many thanks to lan and Mandy Stirling for making it happen and for the pizza-making demonstration followed by a delicious, shared lunch for volunteers. We hope to prepare more food in the garden, using our own produce where possible.

Our Head Gardner, Patsy, ran a session in May with Crosshill Guides where she took them through the process of planting and growing tomatoes.

Simon and Bryan gave a presentation at Carrick Academy to the Head Teachers of the Carrick Cluster on how we can support local schools.

On Saturday, 10th June from 12-3pm, the Garden was the venue for a community arts exhibition, "Catch a Drift", celebrating local people and spaces. Groups from Maybole showed the works they have prepared, and the event will also feature arts activities, food and music.

Gardening for wildlife


As well as our regular activities, we are also working to encourage more wildlife into the garden. Our recent activities in this area include:

- Planting a hedgerow of native species with plants provided by The Woodland Trust.
- Constructing and installing birdboxes using recycled timber.
- Re-sowing the wildflower meadow following on from its spectacular success last year.
- Hosting a visit to the CCFG from Lynne Bates of the Scottish Wildlife Trust who is the lead for the Irvine to Girvan Nectar Network.

There is a lot more scope within the garden to create and improve wildlife habitats and we welcome your input and help.

Construction and maintenance

There is always work to do in the garden for those who don't have a green thumb or who just prefer

NCCBC - Manager Update Spring 2023

Charity Shop

Encouraging signs of progress at the start of the year have sadly fizzled out. The contractor's high level of staff turnover has caused new delays and the completion date has slipped into September.

NCCBC is exploring how the shop should be used to complement the existing Charity Shop in School Vennel.

Foundations For Recovery - A Programme for Action

The Strategy for North Carrick document at **www.nccbc.org.uk/foundations-for-recovery/** outlines the programme of action and will guide the work of a new Development Trust that is being set up.

"North Carrick 2030" will have a mission to support local communities to implement as much as possible of the Foundations for Recovery projects within seven years.

Dunure

Included in the £15m of capital projects is a project of around £6m for repairing and improving the harbour, a new Community Heritage Centre in Kennedy Park, improved car parking, a DDA compliant route joining the Centre to the harbour.

With NCCBC support Dynamic Dunure drafted a brief and recruited consultants to develop an application to the National Lottery Heritage Fund. This will be for a grant of up to £5m. It is a 3-stage process: Expression of Interest; Stage 1, if successful, leads to development funding for; Full Application.

Dynamic Dunure are using their current £10,000 of NCCBC Community-led Projects funding to get the application process underway. Recognised experts in the Heritage sector have started work to produce:

An Expression of Interest (including revising and resubmitting if needed).

An Interpretation Plan suitable for the Stage 1 application.

A Business Plan for the New Centre suitable for the Stage 1 application.

Arts and AR Trail Five months after NCCBC was told that a £50,000 grant had been confirmed, the relevant paperwork to allow the project to commence has still not been provided. But this project will get underway and communities should soon see artists in the villages exploring links to King Robert the Bruce and discussing what kind of artwork might be installed.

Heritage Enterprise Village A three-year project is about to begin with £118,500 of Strengthening Communities Programme funding. This is focused on 'market-making' for heritage enterprises and their

customers and will develop a flagship site in a town or edge-of-town location and subsidiary sites and a network of heritage enterprises across North Carrick.

Bruce 2024 (AKA Bruce 750) NCCBC is staging a Heritage Day Event for 2023, themed on Bruce, and laying foundations for major events in 2024. £3,500 towards the costs of this year's event will come from the Heritage Enterprise Village budget to support a youth event.

Lion of Carrick A team of consultants has been appointed to use the £20,000 allocated by NCCBC to develop the proposals for the planned nationally significant statue. We have approached two separate funding programmes to support the cost of the statue and the costs of the associated infrastructure.

Minishant Eco-Park

Minishant Social and Leisure Group secured £8,500 of Coastal Communities funding and appointed consultants to complete a Feasibility Study that will design the proposed Eco-Park. NCCBC's Assistant Manager, Claire, is supporting the group as the project progresses.

North Carrick E-Bikes

As part of the Foundations for Recovery programme, NCCBC bought 12 new E-Bikes. Working with South Ayrshire Community Transport, a new scheme for hiring E-Bikes to visitors will be launched this summer.

Cost of Living

NCCBC secured £15,000 from The National Lottery and has allocated up to £50,000 of its own funds to support people through the current crisis.


A contractor is working on a short project involving:


- Bags for over 1000 school children containing items focussed on keeping the children warm and healthy.
- Vouchers for 300 people living in North Carrick who are 'most in need'. To be used locally to obtain food, power, or mobile top ups.
- "Techy" bags for 750+ people living in North Carrick who are 'most in need'. These will include items such as battery-operated LED light switches with batteries, mobile phone power banks, etc.
- A well-publicised knitting campaign to challenge members of the community to knit 500 draught excluders in addition to the 500 to be bought by the project.

Youth Strategy

Implementing the Strategy for Youth in North Carrick, produced with NCCBC support, will get a boost from the Carrick Centre's planned reopening of Goudie's as a dedicated North Carrick Youth hub.

An Outline of NCCBC's Plans





COST OF LIVING PROJECT



NCCBC has been awarded funding from the Community Anchors Fund to support people in our communities by helping to alleviate some of the immediate cost of living pressures.

A voucher scheme is being set up to help people who are most in need due to financial circumstances, health, isolation, and other similar factors. The vouchers can be used in several local shops to pay for gas and electricity, food and mobile phone top-ups and will be distributed through a number of different channels.

In addition to the voucher scheme, a limited number of 'techy' bags will also be made available. These bags will contain various items such as LED battery operated light switches, stainless steel flasks and mobile phone power banks.

This month, NCCBC is launching a knitting campaign, where children and adults can learn to knit (or help each other to knit) a Centipede

Draught Excluder. This project will soon be commencing in our schools, with members of the community getting involved to help teach the children how to knit. NCCBC are offering a free pack, with all the materials required, to anyone who would like to get involved. Packs will be available to collect from Libby's Handbags, School Vennel, Maybole from July onwards, on a first come first served basis. The draught excluder can then be used to 'keep the heat in' over the winter months.

The final part of this project is to provide a goodie bag for school children of varying age groups who live within North Carrick. The goodie bag will contain items focussed on keeping children warm and healthy. NCCBC is in dialogue with schools and other organisations and groups to identify what items are best suited to the needs of the children.



Straiton Community Projects Fund

Using the annual grant from NCCBC, Straiton Community Projects Fund Local Panel has completed a number of successful projects.

The stone planters have been amazing this year

with a very colourful array of winter, spring and summer flowers. In partnership with Straiton Primary School an area was cleared near the Community Garden and a polytunnel was purchased. Students from Ayrshire College, taking part in the

Princes' Trust Scheme, helped clear the area.

Pupils have already started to enjoy growing a large variety of plants.

The village hall clock was taken away by Cumbria Clock Company for repairs, cleaning, and restoration. The clock has now been returned and is a welcome

sight to villagers who missed the iconic chronometer.

Two bespoke wooden notice boards have been installed outside the village hub, Straiton



Village Stores, and will be used for village notices and key information like bus times, post office,

bank and library times.

Another successful partnership with South Ayrshire Council allowed two new accessible picnic tables to be purchased



from David Ogilvie Engineering. SAC then removed the old tables and secured the two new tables.

Finally, a bench and plaque were purchased to remember the late Bruce Henderson, who was latterly a member of Straiton Environment Group.

In summary this has been another successful year for the community of Straiton, listening to and voting on their ideas to make good use of the annual NCCBC funding via the Community Projects Fund.



E-Bike North Carrick, which is operated by South Ayrshire Community Transport (SACT) has 12 E-Bikes available (based at the Carrick Centre) for rent by residents for up to four weeks, at cost of only £60. E-Bikes are great to build confidence, ability, and fitness, especially if you don't think a regular bike is right for you. The idea is that at least some of the people who hire E-Bikes will go on to buy their

E-Bike North Carrick also has 12 E-Bikes that are available for visitors to North Carrick for shorter term hires. This initiative will boost sustainable tourism in the local area, enabling visitors to use E-Bikes rather than other forms of transport to access local tourist sites and services. These new E-Bikes are owned

own bikes.

E-Bike North Carrick

by North Carrick Community Benefit Company through it's 'Foundations for Recovery' programme, with UK Government funding. The programme has a key focus on tourism – developing the concept of a 'Bruce's Web' linking Maybole and the surrounding North Carrick villages. As well as a hub in Maybole, SACT are working in partnership with local organisations to become 'hosts' – which will increase the flexibility and accessibility of hiring the bikes. These E-Bikes will be hired out at £36 per day with 55% of the income going to the host organisation.

A special tea party was held to help raise money to support the growing demands on a local food bank.

Centre Manager Andrea Hutchison said: "The Food Bank has been part of our centre for over 11 years and during that time we have worked together to support food stability for families in Maybole and the surrounding areas. On any given week they serve over 75 individuals/families.

"The impact of the service goes beyond the simple provision of food. The conversations around food preparation and simple ideas to make food stretch further, the introduction of new foods that are cheap and healthy and the basic human contact with someone who will not judge you, who will meet you where you are and will try to assist you however they can, can be as the advert says "priceless.""

She said the food bank volunteers provide a listening ear, they provide information on other services in the area and they are often able to "find" a coat or something else that someone might need. They are a precious resource to us and are very much part of our team. She added: "Unfortunately, the numbers using the food bank are growing weekly and as the cost of living crisis shows no sign of abating we are looking at ways to stretch this already stretched service even further. Without the wonderful volunteers and the generous donations from the good people of Maybole and the villages we would not be able to have the range and impact that we do."

"We wanted to be part of the Tea for Trussell event to demonstrate to our Foodbank staff and volunteers how much we appreciate them and the tireless work they do and that they continue to have our love and support as we do this work together."

The Trussell Trust supports over 1,200 food bank centres across the UK. Together, they provide emergency food and support to people locked in poverty, while also campaigning for change to end the need for food banks in the future.

Isn't nature full of surprises?

Like most people, I had always thought that our wildflower bed next to Crosshill's football field was a big disappointment due to the regular flooding of the site. It certainly didn't look as good as other local flower beds last summer.

But nature has a way of catching you out. In

mid-May, I took a few photos to show the Cuckoo
Flower (Cardamine pratensis) that had appeared.
The flowers bloom at the same time as the arrival of cuckoos, hence the name. This small, pink-white flower, also known as 'Lady's Smock', comes up

every spring if the grass isn't cut.

I was delighted to see that our flower bed had attracted some Orange-tip butterflies (Anthocharis cardamines). These tiny white butterflies were rare in Scotland up to the 1980s, found only in Dumfries & Galloway and a few small colonies in South Ayrshire. Nowadays, Orange-tips are a common sight in south-west Scotland. You might even find some in your garden. Some of these tiny white butterflies may have been moving through to other sites, stopping off briefly at

Crosshill's flower bed for a quick snack on our flowers. It's a bit like a wildlife motorway service area. However, many are now resident here with females laying eggs on the Cuckoo Flowers, ready for the next generation to hatch out. So, I'll be looking more closely at our flower bed throughout the year. It could hold other surprises.

directing the viewer to videos created by the children. All the children have enjoyed working together and learning new dramatic skills and being a




part of the Maybole Regeneration Project.

another great year ahead for the Hub!


